The neighborhood served by Hope Online through Center of Hope Academy's Learning Center is considered a troubled area; gangs, crime and violence are predominate. Holly Santistevan, Director of Center of Hope Academy, is committed to providing at-risk youth from the surrounding community a safe place to learn.

Often due to parental drug problems or incarceration, the majority of the Hope Online students at Center of Hope Academy come from single-parent homes or are being raised by other family members. Unfortunately, some of the Hope Online students at Center of Hope Academy have already been assigned parole officers for criminal offenses committed prior to their enrollment at Hope Online. "At Center of Hope Academy, these students have an opportunity to participate in engaging customized online curricula and benefit from mentor support in an environment that encourages positive decisions and behavior," says Ms. Santistevan.

"I was prepared for these students to be behind academically, but even I was shocked," asserts Ms. Santistevan. "We have high school students who, upon enrolling, could not multiply or divide; their reading and writing skills were at 2nd and 3rd grade levels." Fortunately, in its second year of operation, Hope Online at Center of Hope Academy is seeing academic improvement amongst students. Erin Smith, Hope Online's highly qualified teacher, notes, "one 12th grader works diligently to complete her lessons early each day so that she can assist younger students. Demonstrating great commitment to academics, she is earning A's in all of her courses, passed the Accuplacer test on her first attempt, and is a candidate for graduation in spring 2008."

Not only high school students, but also elementary students benefit from Hope Online. "A 1st grader, who was at a pre-school level, has made excellent progress and a 2nd grader, who is a semester ahead of her grade level, continually requests more assignments. Hope Online gives these students the opportunity to work on an individual learning plan at their own pace and therefore develop a strong academic foundation," adds Ms. Smith.

Ms. Santistevan believes Hope Online's customized curriculum and low mentor to student ratio afford students at Center of Hope Academy a fantastic educational option. "Many of the students are behind, but they can work at their own pace without pressure from their classmates." She adds, "Although we have to continually remind students about their work, and they, being kids, like to argue and act out from time to time, we still see the big picture. The students, who originally gave us a difficult time, now see that graduation is a reality. They know that they can break their neighborhood's trend of crime and start a new trend of graduation and college. That is tremendously rewarding."
